




#### Dear IPSO colleagues,

We can say that IPSO had losses and also had gains throughout the year and all of us, as IPSO members, have to be conscious of what is happening with the IPSO annual balance.

In the table below, we can see that the number of IPA candidates has increased, which is great news as one of the primary goals of the IPA Board of Directors is to invest in increasing the number of candidates while at the same time supporting current candidates so they are able to complete their training. However, we can also see that the number of IPSO members has had an significant decrease this year and, as history has shown, this tends to occur in non-Conference years. We need to acknowledge that we have been losing members every non-conference year and we need to ask ourselves what being part of IPSO means—at the Institutional level within the IPA and in the psychoanalytical world. What can we gain by investing in our community?





Peer groups are an essential part of training and on-going learning throughout our careers. This is the idea behind the creation of IPSO's new cross regional study groups. "When horizontal links are independent of these authority figures, a space can be created for building authentic solidarity links. Concerning the candidate activity within IPSO's Visiting Candidate Program (VCP) we only had three visitors in the last six months, but we had a much larger number of applications with planned visits until summer 2015:

The visiting candidates in the last six months were Denise Steibel from the Psychoanalytical Society of Porto Alegre/Brazil who, in June 2014, visited the Institute of the BPAS/London, UK; then Teresa Abreu from the Portuguese Psychoanalytical Society/Portugal, who visited the BPAS in London just four months later in October, and the third visitor was Ana Brenda Glez Solorsano from the Institute of Psychoanalytic Association in Guadalajara/Mexico who, in September 2014, visited the Institute of the Psychoanalytical Association of Uruguay. We wait with great interest for their reports about their experiences during the VCP, who were not yet at hand at the date of publication of this Newsletter.

There are six applications of candidates from India, Italy, Spain, Mexico, Brazil and Argentina who wish to visit Psychoanalytical Institutes/Societies in either London/UK, Italy, Paris/France, Montevideo/Uruguay or San Francicso/USA.
